This half term Ruby Class will be focusing on literacy reading the classic children's story 'Charlotte's Web' by E. B. White.

Plot Overview

Wilbur, a pig, is saved by a young girl named Fern. He's sold to the Zuckermans, where he meets Charlotte, a friendly spider. When Wilbur faces the threat of being butchered, Charlotte writes messages in her web to save him. Through her cleverness and kindness, Charlotte helps Wilbur escape death.

Key characters

Wilbur	A young, kind-hearted pig who is the main character in the story.
Fern	A young girl who saves Wilbur the pig from being eaten.
Charlotte	A wise and caring spider who befriends Wilbur and tries to save his life.
Templeman	A selfish rat who helps Wilbur in exchange for food.
Mr Zuckerman	The owner of the barn where Wilbur lives.

Key Vocabulary

Friendship - a supportive relationship between people who care for each other.


Loyalty - a strong feeling of support for someone or something. **Devotion** - a deep commitment or dedication.

Tragic - something that causes great sorrow or sadness due to loss.

Butcher - a person who slaughters animals for their meat. **Web** - a complex structure of silk threads created by a spider to catch their prey.

Elwyn Brooks White (1899-1985) was an American author, born in New York, who wrote many children's classics such as 'The tale of Stuart Little' and 'The trumpet of the swan. The youngest of 6 children, he moved from the city onto a farm he bought with his wife in 1938 and took inspiration for Charlotte's Web when he bought a pig for the farm and after nursing the pig through sickness decided to keep it as a pet.
