
Coasts Knowledge Organiser

| headland | a piece of land that sticks out from the coast | | |
| cliff | a very high area of rock | | |

| destructive waves | Destructive waves destroy the coast by removing material away. | | |
| constructive waves | Constructive waves place sediment (sand, rocks, pebbles etc.) down by the coast, adding to it. | | |
