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Introduction:

This report examines the results of the Unique School Survey created by staff at Bewsey Lodge Primary School and concluded on 08/10/2024. The report measures the levels of satisfaction in the school community for a range of criteria, chosen by the staff of the school.

This report gives results identifying the school's perceived strengths and weaknesses (as seen by the respondents) for the period ending 08/10/2024, and also measures performance with regard to overall satisfaction and improvement.

The Instrument is based on questions written by the school. The report was written by ASDTi Ltd using a system popular in Schools, Academies and Colleges since 2008.

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On line surveys are the most up-to-date and swiftest means of collating, diagnosing, and acting upon, the Stakeholder Voice. Outstanding schools are in tune with their community of stakeholders' expectations and perceptions. Through this they achieve better student progress. The instrument is part of a 'family' of listening tools originally released during 2008 by ASDTi.


A total of 186 responses were received.

Group/Year Distribution:-

The distribution of responses, totalled according to the respondents' year group is as follows:

Pupils in Year 1: 23 surveys were completed.
Pupils in Year 2: 40 surveys were completed.
Pupils in Year 3: 23 surveys were completed.
Pupils in Year 4: 28 surveys were completed.
Pupils in Year 5: 31 surveys were completed.
Pupils in Year 6: 41 surveys were completed.

Responses and Don't Knows'

One basic way to judge the effectiveness of a school's relationship with its pupils is to look at the number of respondents who answered each question with 'don't know'. These scores don't affect the school's average score, or the standard deviation, because the questionnaire users concerned felt they didn't know enough to rate the school in this area.

It is therefore useful for the school, to help it understand the areas in which respondents feel they don't have enough information - and therefore in which areas the school could perhaps improve its communications.


- 1. 13 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement one (Over the last 4 weeks, I have usually felt happy.).
- 2. 7 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement two (I don't usually worry about things.).
- 3. 6 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement three (Being at school makes me happy.).
- 4. 9 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement four (I don't worry about school or my work.).
- 5. 20 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement five (I am looking forward to the future, it will be good.).
- 6. 11 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement six (At school there are adults who listen to me, if I feel worried.).
- 7. 4 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement seven (I am happy with the kind of life I have.).
- 8. 21 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement eight (My life is better than most kids.).
- 9. 6 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement nine (I usually feel calm and relaxed.).
- 10. 8 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement ten (I don't worry about my friends or bullying.).
- 11. 5 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement eleven (I don't often get angy or sad, and it is easy for me to control my emotions.).
- 12. 10 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement twelve (In our school, we learn about how important it is to talk about our feelings, and our emotions.).
- 13. 9 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement thirteen (In our school, we learn how we can help ourselves to have a healthy mind (mindfulness etc.)).
- 14. 5 pupils answered 'Don't Know' to statement fourteen (I believe I can make a difference if someone else is feeling worried or unhappy.).

For each of the questions in the main body of the report, we give the score distribution as a percentage of those who expressed a preference, so they will always add up to 100% (allowing for rounding errors).


score Graph:

Key: The Black line represents the average score for Bewsey Lodge Primary School.

This survey result is good, with 11 statements scoring above '4' ('Agree a little' - 66.67%) and with 3 of the 14 statements scoring between '3' and '4' ('Disagree a little' - 50% and 'Agree a Little' - 66.67%). 5 of the 14 statements were scored above '5' ('Agree' - 83.33%) - an excellent score.



The analysis that follows is not intended to be a fully-comprehensive summary of what is held in the data and its natural solutions and actions. Rather it is a first assessment of major findings of the Instrument and some pointers to areas in which the SLT may like to begin any developmental work.



Question One: Over the last 4 weeks, I have usually felt happy.



























How rould the school be Improved?

The respondents to this survey in Bewsey Lodge Primary School were each asked to supply two ways in which the school could be improved (related to the topic of the survey). These comments are reported without comment next:-

It is important to view this section constructively and without attempting to ascribe 'blame'.

Respondents were advised that comments that 'named' individuals would not be saved (an anonymous survey like this is not the best forum to raise any specific personal issues of that kind), and they are also all prevented from using certain words (primarily swearing and abusive comments).

- Where possible the survey attempts to correct spelling errors.
- Respondents are free to say 'nothing' if they can think of no improvements.
- The survey replaces strings of clearly random text with the word 'nothing' or 'nothing else'
- All respondents have been assured that their comments are anonymous.

It is important, therefore for the school not to attempt to single-out any respondent (whether parent, carer, pupil, student, staff member, or group of them) - the survey should not be used to target, highlight, bully or discipline individuals or groups in this manner. It must be used (under the terms of your licence) sensitively, inclusively and constructively by the school/college, and in line with good pastoral and HR practice - and, indeed in compliance with legislation.
